

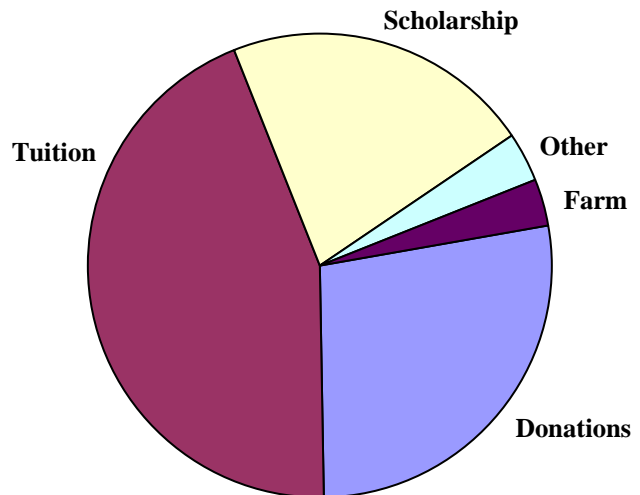

2007-08 Income Summary

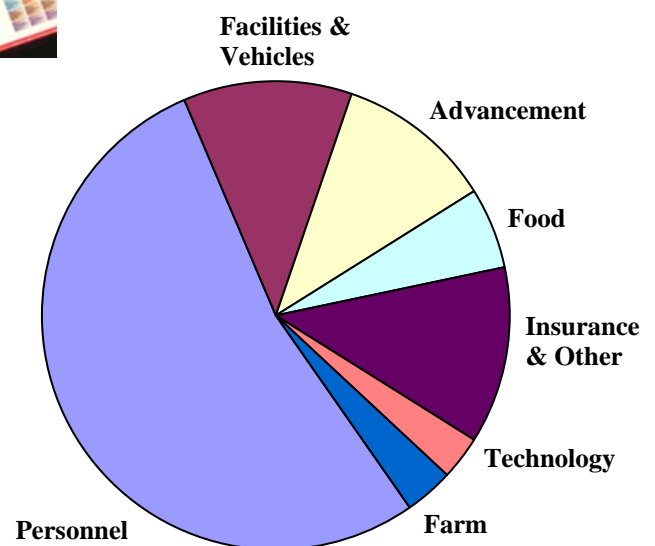
